Beginning the first week of May, invitations to the Senior Scholarship Ceremony will be sent to all those from whom we have received confirmation of receiving a scholarship.

Hamilton Girls Basketball Club is once again offering a \$500 scholarship to one female HHS basketball player. Student must have participated in the Hamilton Basketball Club's Junior Charger program for a minimum of three (3) years and have played four (4) years of basketball for HHS. In addition, the applicant must have attained a GPS of 3.0 or higher and have been accepted by a technical school or a four year university. There will be up to three scholarships awarded in the amount of \$4,000 and are renewable for a second consecutive year. To be eligible, students must plan to enroll in post-secondary education (two or four year) with a demonstrated financial need. Students must have at least a 3.5 GPA, be a U.S. citizen and demonstrate community service through extracurricular activities, work, religious or volunteer activities.
