PLANNING FOR AFTER HIGH SCHOOL

It is definitely not too early to begin to investigate options for after high school! Below are some suggestions to help you get information you need:

- Pick up a list of helpful websites for financial aid, college exploration, career planning, etc. in the Guidance Office.
- Visit websites of the colleges you are interested in.
- Look at college catalogs (also available in the Guidance Office).
- Meet with college representatives who visit Hamilton (watch daily announcements for up-coming college rep visits)
- Take advantage of opportunities such as career nights at WCTC, open houses at colleges/universities.
- Attend college fairs.
- Get involved in school and community activities.
- Review your transcript to be sure you are on track for graduation and for admission purposes.
- Log on to www.uwhelp.wisconsin.edu for information on UW Systems schools and programs. Log on to www.wisconsinprivatecolleges.org for information on private colleges and universities in Wisconsin. Log on to www.witechcolleges.org for information on the technical colleges in Wisconsin.

Junior conferences will be scheduled first semester and you will meet with a counselor to discuss your individual plans.

TESTS

If you are planning on going to a four year college or university, you must take either the **ACT or SAT I**. It is very important that you take these tests seriously and prepare appropriately. The best preparation is to take core curriculum that helps you develop the knowledge and skills that are tested and considered to be important for success in college. It is also helpful to take advantage of test preparation programs and activities so you understand the format of the test and effective test taking strategies. The ACT and SAT are not only used in college admission, but also to determine athletic eligibility, for scholarship purposes and for programming opportunities while in college. If you are planning on attending a technical college, a different test will be administered to you once you have applied.

The PSAT, a shortened version of the SAT I, is for students who are planning on attending a college or university and is taken in the junior year. It is also the qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarship Program. The PSAT will be given Wednesday, October 17th, 2018. Listen for information about registering.

Note: If you are hoping to attend a UW System University, you should apply around September 1st or soon thereafter next school year (when you are starting your senior year). Transcripts should be submitted through Parchment (information available in the Guidance Office), an online service provider.
