Wisconsin winters can be unpredictable, but this winter has been exceptional when it comes to school closings. To date the district has missed five school days due to inclement weather. Previously it was announced that the Jan. 23, 28 and 31 school closings will be made up on April 22, May 24 and June 12, and there will be no make-up day for Jan. 30.

The Feb. 12 missed day of school will not have a make-up day, however, the high school daily schedule will be adjusted to gain more instructional time. DPI requires more hours of instruction for high school students than it does for those in grades K-8, therefore other schools do not need to make up the day or change their daily schedules.
