

# Positive cases in the home or exposure outside of school

## Close contact with a positive COVID-19 case

Close contact is anyone who had any of the following with a confirmed positive COVID-19 case:

- direct physical contact (hug, kiss, handshake)
- within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes (cumulative for the day)
- contact with respiratory secretions of infected person (coughed or sneezed on, contact with tissue, drinking glass, food, towel or personal item)
- stayed overnight for at least one night in a household with an infected person

**Please let your child's school know if there is a positive case in the home or your child was identified as a close contact as a results of exposure outside of school.**

Is your child fully vaccinated?



- Quarantine for 10 days from the last exposure
- Monitor for symptoms for 14 days
- Optional: If families wish to use a negative test to be released from quarantine before the end of the 14-day quarantine, testing should be done day 6 or later.
- At-home test kits without supervision of a healthcare provider are not sufficient to test out of quarantine.

Your child is not required to quarantine if the exposure was at least two weeks after the last dose of the vaccine series AND he or she does not have COVID-19 symptoms since the date of close contact.

- Monitor for symptoms for 14 days
- Wear a mask for 14 days from exposure or until a negative test
- Waukesha County Public Health Department recommends seeking a test 5-7 days after exposure
