Youth Apprenticeship (YA)

Youth Apprenticeship (YA) connects employers with motivated high school juniors and seniors seeking hands-on experience in a career field. Students earn high school credit while gaining paid workplace experience and developing valuable technical and professional skills. To successfully complete the program, students must complete 450 hours of paid, career-related work experience between July 1 and June 30. Participation is supported through a formal training agreement between the employer, student, parent/guardian, and Hamilton High School.

Work-Based Learning (WBL)

Work-Based Learning (WBL) provides students with the opportunity to gain valuable workplace experience while earning high school credit. Through paid employment, students develop professional skills, explore career interests, and connect classroom learning to real-world experiences. To successfully complete the program, students must complete a minimum of 90 hours of work experience during the semester. Participation is supported through a formal agreement between the employer, student, parent/guardian, and Hamilton High School.
