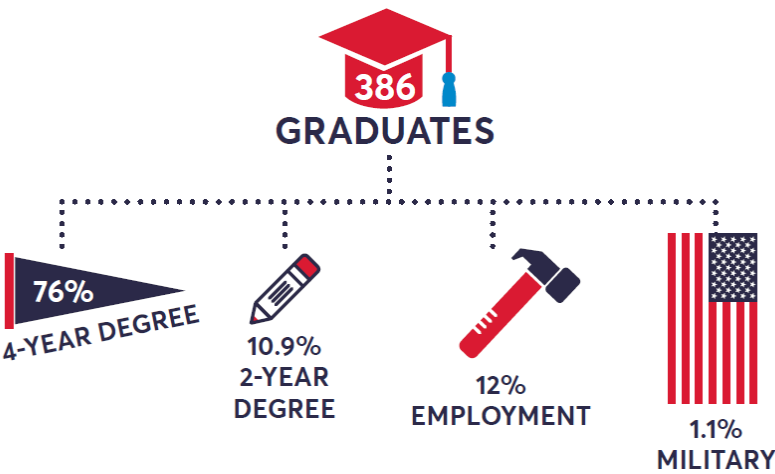

Grades & Class Rank

- Grade point averages are based upon a four point scale with an A being the highest grade.
- AP Classes are weighted and follow the 5.0 AP grading scale. All other subjects are given equal weight.
- Class rank is computed by using official semester grades beginning with the ninth grade and based on students' weighted GPA.
